Suggested Elements for Preparing Children for the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation

THEME: To bring baptized children into a deeper, richer relationship with Jesus Christ through worthy participation in the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation by teaching them they were created to know, to love and to serve God in this world and to live happily forever with Him in the next.

To Know God:	The Coursework. (see attached) Parental Involvement teaching basic terms and concepts.(see Resources.) Properly examining one's conscience.(see Resources)	
To Love God:	Development of Prayer Life Formal Prayers First Communicants should know. (see list) Spontaneous and Other Forms of Prayer	
To Serve God:	Participation in the prayer and liturgical life of the Church, i.e. Mass Attendance, Communal Rosaries, etc. Learning to forgive and seeking forgiveness, thus bringing oneself others to Christ. A First Communion Banner celebrating Eucharist.	
A First Communion Retreat (optional)	Coloring station highlighting the parts of the Mass. (see <i>Resouces</i>) Craft station highlighting the Last Supper. Tasting station where students taste unconsecrated hosts and wine. Letter-writing station where students write a letter to Jesus thanking Him for those things about which they feel blessed in their own lives. Students spend approximately 20 minutes at each station.	
A Parent's Holy Hour (optional)	Held concurrently with First Communion Retreat. Exposition and Adoration. End with Benediction. Handout on how to prayer the Rosary and Rosaries.(see Resources.) Appropriate Spiritual Readings on Eucharist, Confession, etc. (see Resources)	
First Communion/ Reconciliation Parents' Meeting(s)	First meeting: Catechize parents on the Sacrament of Eucharist. Explain requirements: dates, attendance, banners, etc. Encourage parents to help with terms and prayers, possibly through family prayer time. (see Resources) Second Meeting: Catechize on the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Tips for Parents on preparing children for First Reconciliation. Hand out banner materials. Third meeting: Explain how First Communion will work, times, photos, seating, etc. (can be held after Parent's Holy Hour if one is offered.) (see Resources for sample meeting agendas.)	

Sample First Communion/First Reconciliation Coursework Outline

<u>Texts:</u> It is suggested a standard First Communion text from a reputable publishing company (Sadlier, Ignatius Press, Loyola Press, etc.) be utilized supplementing with appropriate grade-level texts as needed.

<u>A Note on Scheduling:</u> Coursework will, of course, need to be adjusted given the varying dates and times different parishes offer these sacraments, whether a parish holds a retreat, etc.

Living a Life pleasing to Jesus (four sessions):	Prayer. Formal, Spontaneous, and Other types. Vocation –Religious, Single, Married, Ordained. Practicing Virtue –Cardinal and Theological. The Communion of Saints –Church Militant, Church Suffering, Church Triumphant.	
Preparing for First Communion: (seven sessions):	Definition of a Sacrament. The Matter and Form of Sacraments. The Last Supper –the New Passover, the Paschal Mystery, both a meal and a sacrifice.(three sessions) The Parts of the Mass –Liturgy of Word, Liturgy of Eucharist. God Speaks to Us. We respond.(two sessions) Jesus' Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament. Scriptural basis. The Eucharist as Source and Summit of Our Faith.	
Our Duties to God: (three sessions)	Mass Attendance –Sunday and Holy Days- and regular confession. The Church as Christ Speaking to us. The Magisterium. Seeing Christ in others.	

Prayers:	Prayers should be practiced in two-week increments both in class (beginning and end) and at home.
