CALLED FROM BAPTISM

Your first grader is learning that all vocations work together to serve people and glorify God. When your child was baptized, he or she became a part of this family of people who are called by God. This calling to be close to God is the most important vocation. Later in life, God calls people to a particular path, or vocation, in life. He calls people to religious life, marriage, or the priesthood. Look back on your child's baptism, the seeds of participation in the Divine calling.

At baptism, the priest or deacon said,

"The Christian community welcomes you with great joy. In its name I claim you for Christ our Savior by the sign of his cross. I now trace the cross on your forehead, and invite your parents (and godparents) to do the same."

Trace the sign of the cross on your child's forehead as a blessing and reminder of who he or she is.

Say to your child, "God has great plans in store for you!"
