OVERVIEW

OBJECTIVE: to gain a simple understanding of the lives of religious brothers and sisters.

MAIN CONCEPTS:

- A religious person gives his whole life to loving God and others.
- A consecrated religious does not get married.
- Religious make special promises to God.
- A religious woman is called "Sister," and a religious man is called "Brother."
- Sometimes consecrated religious wear special clothes called habits.

INTRODUCTION

2 min

Summarize today's theme:

Through these units we hope to become familiar with the vocations to which God calls people so that you will be able to follow his call always. Right now, you are in the single state of life, but someday God may call you to a particular vocation-married life, priesthood, or religious life. Today we will learn about the vocation of being a consecrated religious person.

KNOTS

• Explain why religious wear a rope belt with three knots in it.

10 min

- Demonstrate how to tie three knots in a string or yarn.
- Give each student a 10 inch piece of string or yarn and help them tie three knots.
- Students can tuck a portion of it into the side of their waist band and let it hang down like a monk or a nun.
- Have each student write down three little promises they would like to make to God. (ex: I promise to love you. I promise to pray to you every day.)

Refer to image of the three knots.

All consecrated religious make promises to God similar to the way a husband and wife make promises to each other. Instead of a wedding ring, some consecrated religious wear a rope belt with three knots in it. The three knots remind them of the special promises they make to God. They make promises of poverty, chastity and obedience. Let's tie some knots like a religious person.

READING

- · Read "Little Polly" to the class.
- Discuss the reflection questions and any questions of your own.

LITTLE POLLY



PRAYER

BE CURIOUS

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ESTABLISHING THE CONCEPTS

5 min

Quiz the students to see if they grasp the main concepts.

EXPLORATION

15 min

- Using a blank sheet of paper, have the students draw Mary protecting people under her mantle. They can draw their families under Mary's mantle.
- Bring a blanket or sheet to use as Mary's pretend mantle. While others are still drawing, sit a few children down shoulder to shoulder. Put the blanket over their shoulders, and lead them in praying the Hail Mary. Continue to sit groups of children under "Mary's mantle" until everyone has a turn.

Many religious wear something called a scapular. It is a long piece of material about a foot wide that hangs over their shoulders down their back and front. It means that they give themselves to God and that God and Mary will protect them. Sometimes people who are not consecrated religious also wear a scapular, but it is a much smaller version- like the size of a stamp.

Refer to image of a girl named Hannah and her friend, Sr. Peace.

In this picture, the sister is wearing a large, bright blue scapular as part of her habit. The little girl is wearing a small brown scapular.

When people wear a scapular, they know they are protected. What does it feel like to be under Mary's mantle?

On a blank sheet of paper, draw Mary protecting your family under her mantle.

REFLECTIVE PRAYER

- 1. Introduce the meditation.
- 2. Teach the children how to genuflect.
- 3. Bring the class to the chapel, and give each child a chance to come up one by one and genuflect before the tabernacle. If you cannot go to a chapel, bring a statue of Jesus or a cross to the front of the room, and do the same thing.

Genuflecting is a way to tell God, "I love you. You are the Lord. I am here for you. I will do your will." Genuflecting is also a good way to receive God's love. Whether consecrated religious or children, God wants all people to share in His love.

Refer to image of tabernacle.

Let's practice genuflecting. Put your right knee all the way to the ground while keeping your left foot flat on the ground. When you bend down this way, make the sign of the cross.

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
